With the increase in the popularity and capacity



#### STOCKTON PARISH COUNCIL - NOTES OF MARCH 2023 MEETING

These are informal notes only, for a formal record please refer to the authorised minutes on the parish council website.

County Council and District Council Matters - Stratford have increased their council tax by 3.13% for next year and have allocated an extra £50,000 for planning enforcement measures. Warwickshire have increased their council tax by 3.94% and have been given an extra £2.8M from the government for pothole and highway repairs. The Aldi planning application for the new store in Southam is still at the stage of signing off the S106 agreements connected to the development. The pay dispute in the Fire and Rescue Service has been resolved nationally with a pay deal agreed.

#### **Planning Matters -**

**Top New Zealand Farm** (23/00663): new grain store, no objection from the parish council.

Windmill Farm House, Rugby Road (23/00366): erection of hay and machinery barn, stable block and menage, no representation by parish council. **The Crown Inn, High Street** (22/03170); variation of condition due to change of materials, permission granted.

Westfield House, Mount Pleasant (22/03347): reserved matters (access, appearance, landscaping and layout) pursuant to previous outline permission, permission granted.

#### Village Facilities -

**Radar speed cameras:** the parish council will reply to the measures required by the County Council and request that less obstructions are placed in the way of the parish council's plans.

Cemetery repairs: it was agreed that the parish council would undertake minor repairs to headstones that have become loose on their bases.

**Parking on the village green:** the parish council will contact the Church and the School about users parking on the green.

**Hedge trimming** - the parish council agreed to find a contractor to cut back various hedges in the autumn.

#### Coronation Volunteering Day 8 May -

The Village Hall will be holding a Coffee Morning that day and the parish council will look at ways of publicising volunteering opportunities with local

organisations.

#### Letter from Rev. Gillian Roberts

#### (Hatches, matches and) DESPATCHES

It will soon be Easter, when we focus on Jesus rising from the dead, offering us new life with him for eternity. And that seems like a good time to write about the third in our series of "life events": funerals.

Funerals are designed to help us say "goodbye" and to give thanks for our loved one. It helps us face the reality of our loss, to accept the fact that the person has really gone. The funeral also helps us deal respectfully with the body. Although Christians believe that after death we no longer need our earthly bodies, we also know that bodies are important, because God made us physical beings, not just spirits. The respect with which we treat the body of someone who has died is a sign of what they meant to us. It also points us ahead to the physical reality of the new heaven and earth that God has promised, as we commend the person into the care of God.

When someone dies, they are entitled to have a church funeral in the parish where they lived, regardless of whether they went to church or not. A funeral led by the local minister could be held in church, beside a grave or at a crematorium. And the service can be whatever you would like: from live streaming to 1000 people in a marquee in the pub car park or simply the minister and you at the crematorium. Each funeral will reflect the unique life of the person you knew. You can make it special with your choice of music, hymns, readings and tributes. There will be prayers and a quiet time for personal reflection. You can include photos, flowers or even personal mementoes for special ways to make the service personal.

As well as looking back at the life of the loved one, the church is able to add an extra dimension to the service as it looks to the future and talks about God's promises of a time when "there will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." [Revelation 21:4] Whatever your beliefs, hearing these words can bring a sense of immense comfort and peace, even at this most difficult time.

#### My valedictory reflection

As I come to the end of my formal ministry in the Bridges group of six parishes, I wanted to reflect on the past ten years since I was ordained and appointed first as Curate-in-Charge and then Priest-in-Charge.

I can't deny there have been challenges along the way: coping with the emotional impact of the pandemic; the time, energy and finances involved in maintaining six ancient buildings; the battles with the diocese to get the voice of rural ministry heard; the problems of ageing and diminishing congregations.

But I have found that the joys of rural ministry far outweigh the challenges! Here are just some of the highlights, in no particular order:

- Seeing the father, confined to a wheelchair for many years, get out of it to walk his daughter down the aisle on her wedding day. (The bride and I were both in pieces before the service even started.)
- Blessing a new-born baby at the altar rail on Christmas day.
- Seeing people line the streets to say farewell to a beloved neighbour when we couldn't have funerals in church. And giving them a hug when we could.
- Sharing stories of Jesus over a cup of tea or pot of glittery paint.
- Asked to say a prayer at the village Christmas tree lights switch-on.
- People having an encounter with God because of something I have facilitated.
- Having a heart for the oppressed and encouraging people to fight for justice then seeing the results at the Fosse Foodbank, the support for the Carriers of Hope working with refugees in Coventry, and help for farming charities.
- Driving through the early morning sunshine on a Sunday morning to see the sheep grazing in the churchyard at Wormleighton.
- Waving off a coach load of happy, smiling Syrian refugee families on their way home to Coventry after a day out on a farm in Napton.
- Alpha courses, Lent courses, marriage preparation, concerts, meeting the Archbishop, confirmation services, open air services on farms, Messy Church and Messy Church bags, school assemblies, singing, plant sales, pancake parties, soup lunches, people, more people, cake, more cake and so on......

Glory to God and thank you to everyone for a wonderful ten years. The Church is very much alive in this place and our faithful God is at work. Jesus tells us that "I came that you may have life, and have it abundantly." [John 10:10]

#### Headlines - an exceptionally dry and sunny February

In February the average **minimum temperature** was 2.5 deg. C, about one degree above the long-term average (1.4 deg.). The lowest temperature was a -4.3 deg. C on the 6th. The average **maximum temperature** was 10.2 deg. C, nearly three degrees above the long-term average (7.5 deg C). The highest temperature was 16.1 deg. C on the 17th. **Rainfall** was a meagre 4.5 mm this month, compared to the February average of 44 mm. and it only rained on 5 days. The wettest day was the 21st February with 2.5 mm. The **sunshine** total was one third above the February average. The wind direction was predominantly from the northwest,west and south-west (17 days).

**Trivia of the month** - the driest February for 25 years and the driest month since May 2020.

The garden here was started 25 years ago with much optimism, determination and energy, also an almost total lack of understanding just how challenging it would be to make a garden on heavy clay soil. It gets waterlogged, splashy splashy wet in the winter and dries out with deep cracks in the summer.

It is a windy site, there are rabbits, and brambles would quickly take over if it was abandoned for a short period of time. It has proved to be a very useful testing ground for plants which will thrive in such awful conditions.

There are six large compost bins here and the contents are added as a mulch each year, this has helped enormously and the soil is much more workable these days.

There have been many casualties and quite a lot of plants which sulk but don't die. I'm fairly ruthless about removing clumps of this and that which aren't growing well.

Among the stars of the show are asters, verbena, primroses, roses, shrubby winter flowering honeysuckle, viburnums, ornamental grasses, hardy geraniums, birch, bamboo, and too many others to list here.

If you are stuck deciding what to plant and where to plant it please do come and take a look at what works here and also help raise funds for the NGS charity.

The garden is open every weekend from Good Friday until mid September.


